STATEWIDE OPPORTUNITIES AND SERVICES

(available to all CSU employees)

Denver Museum of Nature and Science – 20% discount on memberships

Study Privilege and Scholarship Programs – 9 free credits per year for employees for classes at CSU, CSU-Pueblo, University of Northern Colorado, CSU Online or CSU-Global Campus

50% tuition discount for eligible family members of CSU faculty and staff – at CSU, CSU Pueblo, and CSU-Global Campus

Employee Assistance Program (EAP) – is a no-cost employee benefit program that provides counseling, financial planning services, and legal advice, as well as a comprehensive website to provide guidance and resources on topics ranging from parenting a teenager to planning for emergencies. Access and other resources 24/7 by calling (800) 497-9133. This service is available worldwide – accessible even when you are traveling

Emergency Hardship Loan Fund – CSU has established an emergency loan program available to eligible employees experiencing a hardship for which the employee has an immediate need for financial assistance. The application is reviewed by the EHLF Review Committee (EHLFC) which determines if the loan is reasonable and necessary to meet a bona fide emergency. Examples include expenses related to the death of a family member, being a victim of a serious crime affecting financial accounts, urgent medical treatments not covered by insurance, or an unforeseen, calamitous event creating hardship not caused by the employee. <http://www.hrs.colostate.edu/benefits/EHLF-Program.html>

Working Together Foundation – This Colorado non-profit organization provides emergency grants of up to \$500 to assist state employees and retirees in financial crisis. Assistance may be used for housing, utilities, medical expenses, food, clothing and other basic needs.

Veterinary Care – 20% discount on veterinary services to CSU employees (and all State of Colorado employees). Does not apply to items from the pharmacy, central supply or Diagnostic Lab services

Volunteers in Public Schools (VIPS) – allows for up to 1 hour per week of administrative leave to volunteer in the public schools, no more than 5 hours may be used in a single month. Cannot be used for private schools or to cover travel time <http://www.hrs.colostate.edu/benefits/timeoff-vips.html>

Child Care Options – The state of Colorado offers state employees discounts from Kindercare Learning Centers/Knowledge Learning Corporation, ABC Child Development Centers, Little People's Landing, Kiddie Academy Child Care Learning Centers, Au Pair in America, Gateway Academy and nannypro.com. Nursing Moms Accommodations

Parking Permit – Free for employees with 30 years of service or more

CSU Alumni Association – discounted membership

Public Library card – sign up for a Poudre River Public Library District card for free using your CSU ID.

Family, Couple and Individual Therapy – through the Center for Family and Couple Therapy; half-price of their sliding fee; services to all Larimer County community plus students, faculty and staff here on campus

Youth Mentoring Program

Language classes in Chinese – through the Confucius Institute – 50% discount on weekly classes for children and adults

Office of Training and Development – training and development opportunities for personal and professional growth; courses are free of charge

Parking Discount – offered to Low-Income Earning Employees

Campus Safety and SafeWalk – from dawn until dusk, 7 days a week; trained student escorts are available by calling 491-1155
